

Regular Council Meeting

April 8, 2026

Mayor Wall called the meeting to order at 6:00PM.

PRESENT: Mayor Wall, Council members Lamar, Jardine, Lester and Tupling. Clerk Sima, Joanna Scheibe and Jeanette Cavadini.

EXCUSED ABSENCE- Council member Bayless.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE- Pledge was led by Mayor Wall.

MINUTES- Council member Lamar made a motion to accept March 11, 2026 minutes, Tupling seconded, motion carried.

Second read. Discussion followed. Council member Jardine made a motion to table until May meeting, Tupling seconded, motion carried.

MAYOR'S REPORT-

Supt. Doyal e-mailed a list to council stating maintenance that was performed in March.

Mayor Wall informed council about the progress at the City Shop.

Mayor Wall informed council that Community Clean-Up is scheduled for April 18, 2026, from 9:00 to 12:00 PM.

Mayor Wall informed council that the Town will be applying for a picnic shelter at Railroad for the Niel Asmussen grant. Mayor Wall has secured a grain silo from Carey Glessner for the project if selected. The Town will also be applying for new street lighting through the PUD energy grant. Council member Lester inquired about getting a power box at Triangle Park for lighting. Mayor Wall informed council that Clerk Sima submitted a grant for new hardware at Triangle Park.

Mayor Wall informed council that the playground equipment will be too large for Blue Stem Park after further review, the next option is next to the basketball courts. Discussion followed. Council member Lamar inquired about getting water fountain repaired.

Mayor Wall informed council that the hole drill has been reserved for the weekend of April 19<sup>th</sup> to complete the flag project.

Mayor Wall informed council that if there is an emergency regarding the town that council needs to call him, do not call out to the employees. The council is the legislative body, not administrative.

Council member Tupling gave an update on the trail project.
